So, high blood pressure is a 'risk factor' for developing heart disease (angina, heart attacks, heart failure), stroke, peripheral vascular disease, and kidney damage sometime in the future Other risk factors which also increase the risk of developing these conditions are:

6 Treatment of High BP So, as we know, the treatment of high blood pressure reduces the risk of stroke by about 40 percent, the risk of myocardial infarction by 25 percent, the risk of congestive heart failure by 50 percent, and it also reduces end-stage renal disease, and the incidence of dementia Overall,

What's so bad about high blood cholesterol? Low-density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol is often called "the bad kind" When you have too much LDL cholesterol in your blood, it can join with fats and other substances to build up in the inner walls of your arteries The arteries can become clogged and narrow, and blood flow is reduced

**High Blood Pressure (Hypertension)**

What is high blood pressure? High blood pressure is a blood pressure that is 140/90 mmHg or above each time it is taken That is, the blood pressure is 'sustained' at 140/90 mmHg or above High blood pressure can be: just a high systolic pressure, for example, 170/70 mmHg just a high diastolic pressure, for example, 120/104 mmHg

People who do not have high blood pressure at age 55 face a 90 percent chance of developing it during their lifetimes So high blood pressure is a condition that most people will have at some point in their lives Both numbers in a blood pressure test are important, but for people who are age 50 or older, systolic pressure gives the most

High blood cholesterol itself does not cause symptoms, so many people are unaware that their cholesterol level is too high. It is important to find out what your cholesterol numbers are because lowering cholesterol levels that are too high lessens the risk for developing heart disease and reduces the chance

So what is pre-diabetes? Some patients have a blood sugar level which is higher than normal but not high enough to be called diabetes. This is called pre-diabetes and can be identified by blood sugar (glucose) tests. Technically, pre-diabetes may result from one of three conditions called Impaired Fasting Glycaemia, Impaired Glucose Tolerance
