Developing young children's creativity 1 personality traits, such as self-confidence, being able to tolerate ambiguity, curiosity and motivation 2 emotional processes, such as emotional fantasy in play, pleasure in challenge, involvement in tasks and tolerance of anxiety 3 cognitive abilities, such as divergent thinking, ability
